* **Looking back on the Plan from this current year, what changes have been made in the way the county handles & prioritizes SW?**

Selling the landfill has allowed the county to focus more on collection and customer service. With as many CC visits as we get each year this was a positive for the citizens of the county.

* **List and discuss the three largest obstacles to your solid waste disposal system.**

Funding- Our large and growing population strains the SW budget. Funding increases for projects and equipment can be difficult to come by.
 Adequate coverate - As the county's population continues to grow providing coverage for all areas of the county will become more difficult. Convenience center upgrades/ and addition will likely be needed in furture years.
 Tires - The county is required to fill out large amounts of paperwork and we lose money on the program.

* **In the coming years, how do you plan to handle disposal of waste differently to better address these issues?**

More convenience centers may be needed and existing centers are in need of upgrades as teh county continues to grow. Recycling will likely need to increase to keep pace with the growth, though we are well over the 25% reduction.

We have over half a million visits ot our convenience centers each year and complaints are minimal while level of service is high.

Paint gets into compactors when it's snuck into receptacles.
 Gas tanks wind up on the side of the road near the scrap yards.
